<u>CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – Please read these carefully.</u>

- Programme is CCA Affiliated & run in accordance with the "CCA Rules & Guidelines"
- INJURIES: Any injuries to Riders or Volunteers to be reported to Medical Service Provider
- Saddlery & Dress: All Riders must compete as per CCA 'GENERAL RULES' 11. 1
 Dress & Saddlery Campdraft competitors must wear a hat or safety helmet, boots, collared buttoned long sleeve shirt &
- long trousers in competition at all times. Caps are not permissible. Competitors must be neat & presentable.

 ◆ HELMETS RULE − **UPDATED 16/8/2025 Current & Compliant Helmets must be worn at all times when on horseback.
- CCA Rule 19 "Riders under the age of 18 must wear a helmet at all times whilst riding a horse. Helmets must comply with current Australian & New Zealand safety standards and be securely fastened under the chin at all times."
- Competitors must abide by all CCA & Campdrafting Tas Inc Club Rules, Safety Requirements & Codes of Conduct
- Queries re runs should be addressed to a Riders Rep <u>as soon as possible</u> after your run.
- APPEALS & PROTESTS: as per CCA Rule 10
- DOGS are not encouraged at Campdrafts and should be kept on a Leash or Tied Up AT ALL TIMES.
- ◆ SMOKING/VAPING ** Updated 16/8/25 Smoking/Vaping in designated areas only, as per Club Smoking/Vaping Policy 2025
- ♦ Hi Points— are 15 for 1st, 10 for 2nd, 7 for 3rd, 5 for 4th, 3 for 5th and 1 for 6th placing in each event
- ◆ CLUB SCRATCHING RULE: (Updated 6/8/22)
 - 1. <u>Scratchings, after the Tuesday deadline,</u> must be accompanied by a medical certificate or a vet/professional's certificate for the horse, and *will receive a 50% refund only*.
 - 2. On the Day:

At the meeting on 22 Oct 2011 the procedure for scratching your horse due to illness/lameness at a competition was discussed. The Committee respects each rider's right to acknowledge when their horse is not able to compete for a variety of reasons, and we recognise that the responsible course of action is to scratch.

However if you would like to get your run refund of 50% by Committee you should make every attempt to do the following:

- 1. make 2 members of the Executive aware of your decision
- 2. if possible show these persons the nature of the problem via physical exam/photo/video
- 3. inform the Event Penciller and/or Judge of your decision [50% of entry fee Refunded—Updated 6/8/22]

♦ Horse Substitution

Following illness/injury occurring after Tuesday night, a horse of a similar status may replace the initial entry. No additional events may be entered and any events the replacement horse is not eligible for are considered to be a scratching and entry money forfeited. Please notify the Secretary if substituting a horse.

◆ Finals Qualifications - ** updated 16/8/25

If you have suffered any Hardship you may apply to the Exec Committee for a review.

- i) Horses need to have completed 2 Drafts in the Event you wish to compete in at the Finals.
- ii) CHALLENGE You must compete in 2 Challenge Events to be eligible to enter the Finals MAIDEN Draft.
 - * If a horse changes status, late in the season, it is then granted entry in the higher status level event.
 - iii) If you have competed in the 2 Drafts in any event you are then able to enter the Open Final if you wish.
 - iv) The FINALS Open Draft is open to all classes of horses who have completed the 2 draft qualification rule that season. If a horse changes status, late in the season, it is then granted entry in the higher status level event. (Keep in mind that an Open win will affect your eligibility for some events on that horse in the future).

♦ CODE OF CONDUCT —

Members, Volunteers and Spectators are required to adhere to the Club's & the CCA CODES OF CONDUCT.

Members and competitors should always be aware that campdrafting is a family sport and should whilst competing, dealing with organising committees, other members and volunteers act with integrity, sportsmanship and courtesy.
