



HORSE REGULATIONS

- All competition at this show is governed by these regulations and by the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Rules for Discipline in Horse Sections at Shows which can be viewed at www.agshowsnsw.org.au. Should it become necessary for the ASC Disciplinary Committee to open an inquiry into any aspect of competition in this Horse Section, this Society will support any penalty imposed by that Committee as a result of the inquiry and will support penalties resulting from enquiries arising from Horse Sections at other NSW shows.
- **INDEMNITY AND WAIVER FORMS:** The Horse Committee will take all care in managing the Section, but competitors taking part in this Horse Section do so at their own risk. Each adult competitor must, before competing, complete and sign a form indemnifying the Gresford Show Society and waiving any claims against the Society for any injury sustained in competition or for loss or damage to the competitor's property or damage caused by the competitor or his/her animal(s) at the Show. A similar form must also be completed and signed by a parent or guardian for each competitor who is under 18 years of age. ALSO, all competitors must complete a Horse Health Declaration, each horse with which the competitor has bought onto the Showgrounds must be listed together with the Property Identification Code (PIC) of the property from which the horse came to the Show.
- All Horse Section Entries (Except Campdraft & OTT) will be ticketed entries on the day
- Campdraft entries will be via Campdraft Central and will open on Monday 23rd 2026 February at 8am.
- Participants Indemnity and Waiver Forms (ASC) to be signed and Competitor Cards collected at entry box. All tickets and forms to be handed in and/or purchased at the ring office on the bottom side of the ring.
- All competitors must provide a property PIC on entry forms. **NO PIC - NO RIDE – NO COMPETING**
- Every rider is encouraged to wear a **safety helmet** compliant with the current Australian Standard. All riders and competitors under 18 years of age **must** always wear an approved helmet when competing in the ring, in either ridden or handler classes.
- Age of horses to be calculated from August 1st.
- Stallions and Colts may only compete where specifically permitted. Stallions and Colts must be ridden or handled by a person 17yrs and over.
- Horses in appropriate classes must be registered with their respective Breed Societies and copies of Registration must be available for presentation on request.
- Competitors in ring events are requested to be correctly attired and to have their horse ready to enter the marshalling area as and when directed by the Stewards. Any competitor disregarding the directions and requests of the Stewards will not be permitted to compete in the events about to take place.
- The dispute committee consists of Ringmaster, Assistant Ringmaster and Main Steward of section involved.
- The committee reserves the right to make any alterations to the program of events if necessary.
- All entries are accepted on the understanding that the exhibitor & competitor will abide by the Rules, Regulations & By-laws of the Society.
- All exhibitors and competitors competing in horse ring events and Campdraft events and spectators wishing to enter the ring area must sign an insurance indemnity form and display an indemnity identification arm band prior to entering the ring area.
- All Forms are available at the ring entry office.

- Drug Testing may be carried out at this Show. Any owner &/or exhibitor whose horse presents positive to a prohibitive substance will be subject to investigation by the ASC Disciplinary Committee. Any penalty imposed as a result of an infringement will be fully supported by this Society.
- All animals brought onto the showgrounds are to be in good health.
- All stock/animal bedding must be removed by the exhibitor before leaving the showground. Either take with you or leave on dump pile behind the cattle stalls.
- **Horse Measuring:** No official measuring will take place at the show, but, if a question about height arises, proof of height may be required. In the absence of proof, a decision will be at the absolute discretion of the Ring Master or Chief Steward.

LOCAL: Embraces competitors residing in the Dungog Shire; Duns Creek, Glendonbrook or a Member of the Paterson River & Hinton Wallalong Pony Clubs.

NOVICE: Open to all competitors who have not won a first prize in a solo event at an agricultural show.


INTERMEDIATE: Means one who has not won first, second or third prize in a solo event at a Royal Show.

Show Hunters: Horses in these classes may **not** also compete in Ridden Hack, Galloway, or Pony classes.

Ridden Hack, Galloway, Pony: Horses in these classes may **not** also compete in Show Hunter classes.

PRIZE MONEY CARDS: All prize monies will be paid out at the Top Secretary Office upon presentation of the prize cards handed out in the ring.

4 large eggs	250g (8oz) Butter

1/4 teaspoon of each ground nutmeg, ground cloves & ground ginger	
1/2 teaspoon of almond & vanilla essence	
1/2 teaspoon lemon essence or finely ground lemon rind	

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Method: Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy and let stand overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm x 20cm (8inx 8in). Bake in a slow oven for approx. 3 1/2 to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.




