ASHS STOCKMAN'S CHALLENGE RULES

All horses arriving at the Allora Showgrounds must have a completed Horse Health Declaration and hand in on arrival to the grounds. Allora Showgrounds PIC: QKWW2131.

Dogs are NOT permitted at horse events at the Allora Showground. Penalties may apply.

In the event of a competitor knowingly nominating for an ASHS Stockman's Challenge event that they are not eligible for, that competitor could possibly be banned from competing in any ASHS Stockman's Challenge and may receive disciplinary action.

Amateur Rider - for those members of the Association, who are no longer eligible to exhibit in Youth classes, who are not professionals in the horse industry and who ride their horses for the pleasure of competing against other members who are also not professional;

DISQUALIFICATION will apply if:

- 2.1. Horse/Rider falls.
- 2.2. Horse bucks or becomes unmanageable.
- 2.3. Any blood from spurring or in the mouth from the bit.
- 2.4. Lameness.
- 2.5. Using the incorrect gear as stated in regulations 4 and 5.
- 2.6. Abuse of horse, judges or official.

ATTIRE

3.1. Stockman's Challenge Competitors must be neat and presentable and must be suitably attired and mounted for presentations. 3.2 General Rules Dress Code – Stockman's Challenge competitors are to wear the following dress in all phases: 3.3. Hat - Australian style hat to be worn while competing and during presentation OR 3.4. Helmets - Properly fitted helmets that comply with Australian Standard AS/NZS 3838, or ASTM F1163 and are less than five years old from the date of manufacture are permitted in all phases and are recommended during the cattle work phase. **Helmets are compulsory for riders under 18 years of age.** 3.5 Shirt - long sleeved button up shirt with collar, with sleeves rolled down and buttoned. 3.6. Trousers - jeans or moleskins. Jodhpurs are not permitted except for riders under 13 years. 3.7 A tie for males and females. Ladies may wear a scarf if preferred. 3.8. Boots - Elastic sided short riding boots or high-top boots. Safe and appropriate riding boots (as per Code of Practice for the Horse Industry – October 2009) must be worn at all times.

TACK

4.1. Equipment to be used during the competition includes:

- 4.1.1. Bridle - Single Barcoo bridle. One ear bridles and double bridles are not permitted.
- 4.1.2. Bit - In all phases, a plain loose ring snaffle bit is to be used. This is a free rolling ring snaffle or full cheek snaffle with a smooth mouthpiece and single join. The bit may have loose rings, egg-butt style, D shaped or tom-thumb, the mouthpiece must be single jointed only. Riders under 13 years may use a Spanish snaffle bit with a curb chain.
 - 4.1.2.1. The bit must be no thinner than 3/8" (9.5mm) measured against the cheek. It may have a gradual taper to the centre but must be no thinner than 5/16" (8mm) measured 1" (25mm) from the cheek. The ring may attach with a bar or through a hollow tube but must always be free rolling to prevent leverage. The ring must measure no more than 4" (100mm) in diameter. Loose ring bar bits are permitted.
- 4.2. Twisted wire or gag bits are not permitted.
- 4.3. All bits to be made available to stewards and judges for inspection before and or during the event.
- 4.4. Reins - personal choice.
- 4.5. Saddle - Australian type stock saddle with knee pads and no horn. Fender saddles are permitted. Competitors will not be penalised for the use of a back girth. Western saddles or saddles with a horn are not permitted.
- 4.6. Not Permitted - Tie-downs or martingales of any description. Nose bands or any other artificial device are not to be used. Horses must have free use of its head and any type of head tie-down, running

reins, head checks etc. must not be used. Hackamores and bosals are not permitted. 4.7. Spurs & Whips – Spurs are optional. Suitable spurs are allowed but no riding whip may be carried or used. A stock whip may be required in the Dry Work phase.

4.8. It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure they have the correct gear and adhere to the rules and regulation. 4.8. The judge has the right to call on any competitor to inspect their gear and if gear is illegal, the competitor is required to remove the offending article before competing.

Judge's decision is final.

The nominated horse must have the same rider in all sections. Any alteration is at the committee's discretion.

All nominations cancelled after the 18th of September 2026 will incur a \$20 levy. All nominations cancelled after the 19th of September 2026 will not be refunded except in exceptional circumstances.

All competitors must ride in draw order.

Competitors compete at their own risk.

All competitors must be financial ASHS members or have taken out temporary memberships for the event.

The owner(s) of stallions who have donated services reserve the right to reject any mare they deem unsuitable. The service is non-transferrable. After one breeding season, the service becomes null and void. Vet fees and agistment costs are the responsibility of the mare owner. Method of cover will be at the discretion of the stallion owner.

First in best dressed with the stables (approx. 40 available). Be prepared and bring your own yards/tape.

Please note: a camping fee of \$25/per family for the weekend will be payable with nominations. For any competitors camping prior to Friday the 18th of September, fees will be at the discretion of the Allora Show Society. Please contact the Allora Show Society directly to arrange camping prior to the Friday of the event.

ASHS STOCKMAN'S CHALLENGE RULES

The Cattle Work Section – These Cattle Working Rules are to be considered the rules of choice for all ASHS Cattle Work sections in all challenges including but not limited to the following; Stockman's Challenges, any Futurity or Maturity with a Cattle Work section, any Junior, Juvenile, Encouragement or Open Challenge with a Cattle Work section, and any other ASHS event that includes a Cattle Work section.

In general, the Cattle Work section is similar to a Campdraft. The Cattle Work section consists of four elements as described below. The second, third and fourth elements are to be known as the outside course.

1. The cut out – A beast is to be cut out of a mob and held by itself towards the front of the camp. Competitor to call for the opening of the camp gates when ready to leave the camp.
2. 1st circle/peg – A left or right circle.
3. 2nd circle/peg – A circle in the opposite direction to the 1st peg. 4. 3rd circle/ peg/ gate – A circle in the same direction as 1st peg.

The outside course can be ridden in either direction, left or right of the competitors choosing. 1st, 2nd and 3rd peg should be used. The time limit for the outside course is 40 seconds. Time starts when the beast leaves the camp.

9.2.4.1 The Cattle Work section will be scored out of 100 as follows:

Cut out – 25 points

- ·Beast cut out of the mob and successfully held by itself prior to leaving the camp = scoring 15 – 25 Points
- ·Beast lost back into the mob once = scoring 0 – 15 Points.
- ·Cut out terminated by the Judge = scoring 0 points

First circle/peg – 25 points

- ·Beast and competitor circle around the peg = scoring 15 – 25 points
- ·Either beast or competitor or both do not circle around the peg = scoring 0 – 15 points

Second circle/peg – 25 points ASHS

- ·Beast and competitor circle around the peg = scoring 15 – 25 points
- ·Either beast or competitor or both do not circle around the peg = scoring 0 – 15 points

Third circle/gate – 25 points

- ·Beast and competitor circle around the peg = scoring 15 – 25 points
- ·Either beast or competitor or both do not circle around the peg = scoring 0 – 15 points The judge should address the competitors prior to commencing any Cattle Work section event.

·The judge has the right to terminate any competitor's round at any time.

·The crack of the whip indicates a termination of a competitor's round and the competitor should cease work immediately. The judge's decision is final.

CAMPDRAFT RULES

- Riders to be 13 years & over. Preference will be given to challenge competitors. To be run under ASHS Campdraft Competition Rules.
- The committee reserves the right to restrict runs due to cattle availability.
- Open to unregistered horses.
- Open to maiden horses (Maiden Draft) and maiden and novice horses (Novice Draft) only.
- The owner(s) of stallions who have donated services, reserve the right to reject any mare they deem unsuitable. The service is non-transferrable. After one breeding season, the service becomes null and void. Vet fees and agistment costs are the responsibility of the mare owner. Method of cover will be at the discretion of the stallion owner.
- All competitors must be financial ASHS members or have taken out temporary memberships for the event.
- All horses arriving at the Allora Showgrounds must have a completed Horse Health Declaration and hand in on arrival to the grounds. Allora Showgrounds PIC: QKWW2131.
- Dogs are NOT permitted at horse events at the Allora Showground. Penalties may apply.
- All nominations cancelled before the 12th of September 2026 will incur a \$20 levy.
- All nominations cancelled after the 12th of September 2026 will not be refunded except in exceptional circumstances.
- Nominations open on 1st September 2026 and close on the 4th of September 2026. Nominations on the day will not be accepted.
- Nominations via Campdraft Central.

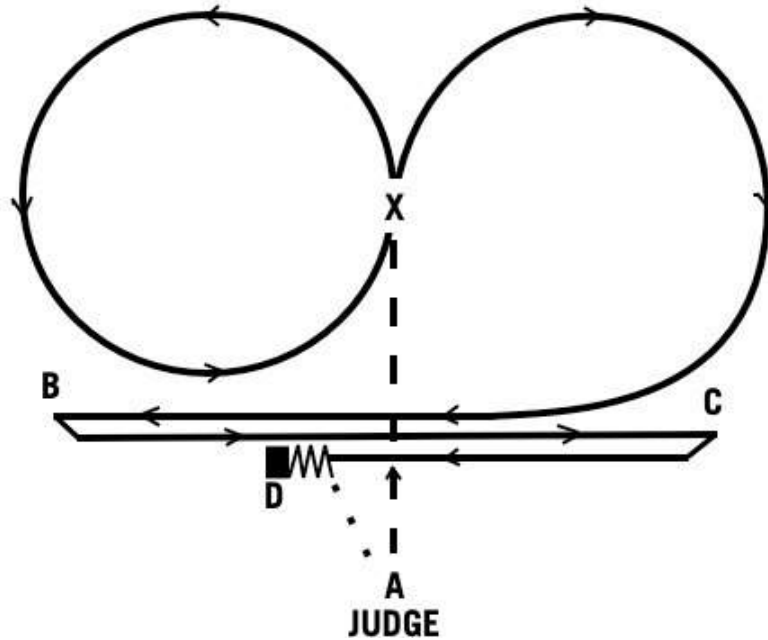

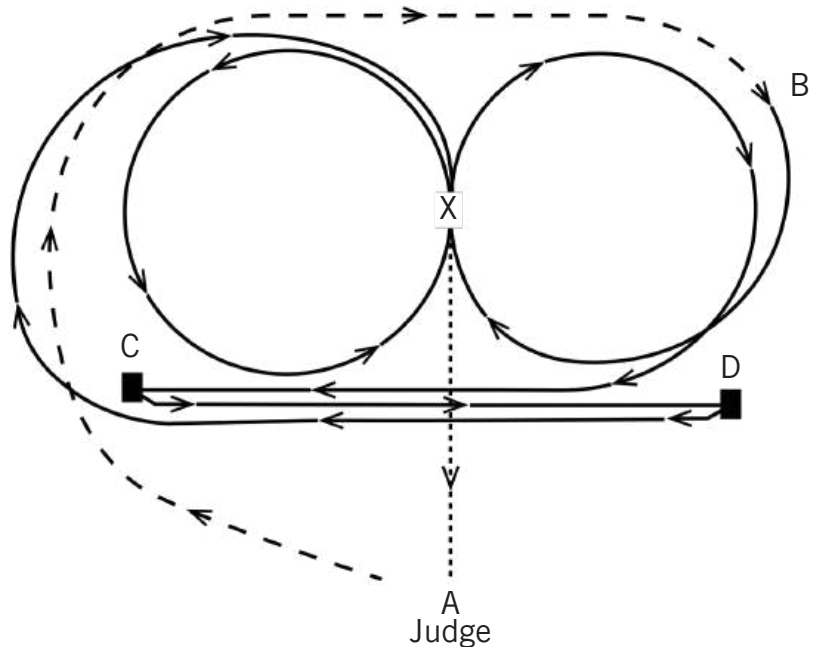

The horse should be obedient to all commands and should be ridden on a light rein throughout the pattern to show a free flowing/ work-like movement through all the paces.

The desire is to see a relaxed, well-mannered young horse in the infancy of its training.

Course

1. Walk through start pegs and continue at walk to gate (B). Pass through gate, opening and closing.
2. Continue past jump (C) leaving it on the horses near side. Turn left and proceed over the jump (C), turn left around the end of the jump, and continue to D.
3. Leave barrel D on horses near side completing a half circle anti-clockwise, circle barrel E clockwise and then circle D half circle anti-clockwise to complete a figure of eight. Continue to the pegs at F
4. Leave the first F peg on horses' off-side, turn right and along the length of log G. Turn 180° left around peg H and along log G. Leave the second peg at F on horses' off-side and turn right.
5. Proceed to I, between the pegs and over the log then turn 180° right and over the log between the pegs.
6. Continue to J, proceed over log (K) three times in a serpentine motion between Pegs J and L, starting with peg J on horses near side.
7. Trot prior to pegs at M, continue at a trot through the finish pegs at A.

- Maximum height of the Jump (C) is 60cm
- Distance from the edges of Barrel D and E is 2m
- (F) pegs are 1m from the outside of log (G)
- The log (G) is 5m long & 20cm in diameter
- (I) pegs are 2m apart, the log is 2m with a diameter of 30cm.
- The log (K) is 8-10m, with a diameter of 30cm
- There is a 1m distance between the pegs at M.

- Trees or pegs driven into the ground should be used in preference to drums
- The lengths and diameters of logs is the minimum required.
- If logs of less than the designated diameters are not available, the logs **MUST** be securely pinned to the ground to prevent all movement.

Note:

- Once the rider's hand touches the gate, the horse may continue at any pace to M.
- In competitions restricted to riders under 13 years, riders must open the gate but do not have to close it.

Penalties

One(1)Second	• Each stride that is broken in the Walk & Trot sections • For each hoof which cross the log at G.
Three (3) Seconds	• Any peg or obstacle knocked down or dislodged • Any obstacle the Judge deems to be sufficiently moved
Elimination	• The horses four feet do not touch the ground on the other side of the logs at I and K before returning over the log • Any section of the course not completely & correctly negotiated

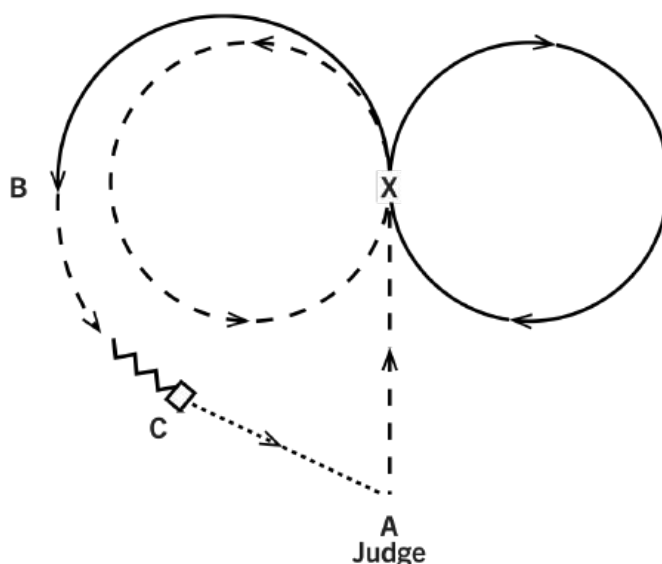

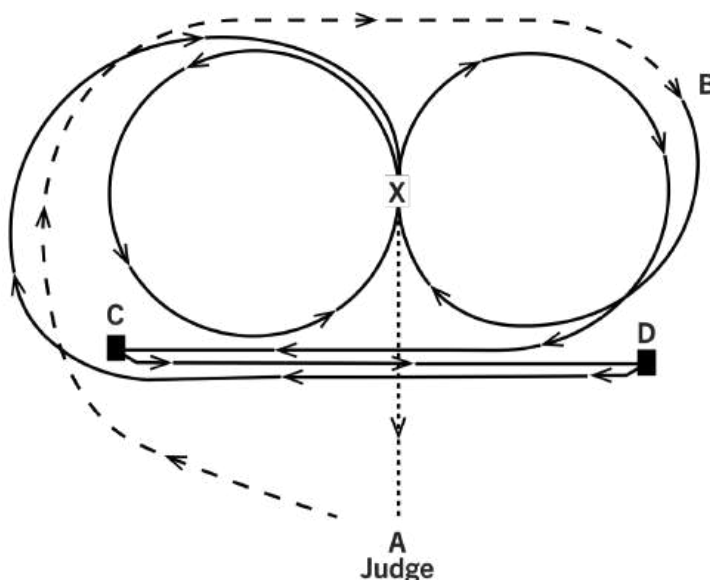
